

Biography Professor Marcel Verheij

Professor Marcel Verheij, The Hague, 28 March 1962, is a Dutch physician and professor of translational radiotherapy who studied at the University of Leiden. He is head of the Department of Radiotherapy at the Netherlands Cancer Institute (NKI) since 2007. He is married and has 3 children.

Verheij completes his secondary education at the Nederlands Lyceum in The Hague, 1974-1980.

1980 – 1981 Foundation course in law, University of Leiden

1981 – 1989 Medical school, University of Leiden

1989 Medical diploma

1996 PhD (cum laude) from the Free University of Amsterdam

Dr. Verheij obtains his PhD with a thesis entitled “Radiation injury of the kidney.

Mechanisms and modulation of endothelial cell dysfunction”.

Work:

1990 Engaged as research physician at the Netherlands Cancer Institute (NKI).

1993 – 2000 Resident physician/radiation oncologist in training in the Department of Radiotherapy of the NKI. This training is interrupted by a fellowship for the Koningin Wilhelmina Fonds (Queen Wilhelmina Fund- Dutch Cancer Society) (1994 – 1996)

2000 Permanent position as radiation oncologist, Department of Radiotherapy at the NKI

2004 Appointment as Professor in translational radiotherapy at the Free University, Amsterdam

2007 Engagement as Head of Department of Radiotherapy at the NKI

Besides this, Dr. Verheij is project leader and research group leader, as well as Head of the Research Department for Experimental Radiotherapy in the Netherlands Cancer Institute..
